Statement by Gateway Corporation Trustees on Legislative Proposal by Senator Schumer

Development Corporation, which oversees delivery of the Gateway Program, issued the following statement on the proposal by Senator Schumer to enable States to move forward with construction on projects in the pipeline for Federal funding with knowledge that they will be reimbursed:

"The legislation proposed today by Senator Schumer would go a long way toward breaking the log jam in Washington over the critically-important Gateway Program projects. We appreciate his ongoing leadership and the commitment of our State and local partners in keeping Gateway moving forward, no matter what. As the recent RPA report showed, the stakes are far too high to allow politics to further delay the start of major construction. We look forward to meeting with the Senate delegations of New York and New Jersey next week to discuss this and other aspects of the Gateway Program."
