IN FIRST CONGRESSIONAL HEARING, SECRETARY BUTTIGIEG CALLS **HUDSON TUNNEL "A PROJECT OF NATIONAL SIGNIFICANCE" &** COMMITS TO COMPLETING EIS "IN SECOND QUARTER OF THIS YEAR."
